

Supplemental Educational Services Offered to Dooly County Students

Both Dooly County Elementary and Dooly County High School will offer Supplemental Educational Services (SES) to students identified as low-achieving for school year 2009-2010. Supplemental Educational Services (SES) is additional instruction designed to increase the academic achievement of students in low-performing schools. These services include academic assistance such as tutoring, remedial services, and other educational interventions consistent with the content and instruction of the school system and aligned with the Georgia Performance Standards. Students from low-income families who are attending Title I schools in their second year of “Needs Improvement” or in “Corrective Action” are eligible to receive these services. Even though Dooly County Elementary made AYP for school year 2008-09, it remains on the Needs Improvement list because schools must have two consecutive years of making AYP to come off the list. Dooly County High School must offer SES because it failed to make AYP and is considered in Corrective Action. Since there is only one school per grade span in the county, School Choice is not an option for Dooly County students.

The Georgia Department of Education has identified organizations that qualify to provide SES. Parents may select a provider from the approved list that they feel will best meet their child’s needs. Priority for service is given to the lowest-achieving eligible students. A list of SES providers is available at the Office of Federal Programs and Pupil Services.
